ADMISSIONS POLICY

The Main Points of Admission into the College are at:

1. 11+. This is the College's First Year (National Curriculum Year 7)
2. 13+. This is the College's Third Year (National Curriculum Year 9)
3. 16+. This is the College's Sixth Form (National Curriculum Year 12)

Specific detail about each of these entry points can be found on the School website.

Entry into the College is Determined Using the Following Selection Criteria:

1. The family must be sympathetic to the Christian, Catholic, Josephite ethos of the College (see below)
2. Performance in the appropriate entrance examinations (11+, Pre-test, Common Entrance or GCSEs)
3. A positive reference from the previous school
4. Demonstration by parents of a clear interest in the College
5. The presence of a sibling already in the College or previous family connections
6. The child is a pupil of the Junior School
7. Performance at interview for all applicants including Sixth Form

Although a day school, because of its location, the College is fortunate to have children whose families bring a wide diversity of national background. We do not discriminate in terms of race, sex or disability. Please see our website for further details regarding provision for children with special educational needs and disabilities. Families seeking more information relating to the Christian and Catholic nature of the school should read the Guidance Notes which are available on request from the Admissions Office.

Parents are advised to raise any queries relating to the admissions process and decisions with the Admissions Manager in the first instance.

Entry into Other Year Groups:

Initial enquiries regarding available spaces outside of our normal points of entry and during the academic year, should be directed to the Admissions Manager. Waiting lists are often held in such circumstances and the above criteria would still apply. Students entering the Fourth Year (Year 10) would need to demonstrate a very strong academic profile to meet the challenges of this point of entry.

Applications are not accepted for Fifth Year (Year 11) or Upper Sixth (Year 13).
